

Flute Fingering Chart

Low B foot joint only.

The chart is organized into seven rows, each containing musical notation for a note and its corresponding fingering diagrams. Key features of the chart include:
 - Finger diagrams using solid black circles for fingers to be pressed and open circles for fingers to be lifted.
 - Alternative fingerings indicated by "or" and "or" in parentheses.
 - Specific instructions such as "(lowers pitch)" and "(add 'gizmo' on low B foot joint only)".
 - A shaded box for the B note in the first row, with the text "Low B foot joint only." above it.

(When more than one fingering is shown, the first is the most common.)
